

The paints and coats industry have progressed in past four decades. In 2018, the industry's growth rate has seen substantial increase by 15-20%. The decorative as well as the industrial sector has been on a progressive note across genres. With the introduction of GST, the big as well as small players have adapted the changes in the Tax System on a positive note. In spite of the fluctuations, the paints and coat industry successfully exceeds demand over supply. Surprisingly, the domestic market continues to field on a better pitch than the International base. The housing sector has benefitted immensely and so has the decorative segments. Manufacturing sector grew at a CAGR of 6.9% between FY12 and FY18, said a report for Paints Sector Industry Analysis.
